Minimum Order for our bulk truck is 3 tons. The truck has a capacity of 4 tons. There are not multiple compartments, so only one bulk feed formula can be hauled at a time. The truck has limited space for up to 20×50 lb bags to be hauled in addition to a bulk load. Example: If someone wanted to order 20 bags of broiler starter and a 4 ton order of 18% broiler grower, this could be done in one hauling trip.

Our Expectation is that we are delivering to a farm with a grain bin on site that is easily accesible for our bulk dumptruck. Our truck will have an auger to move feed from our truck to your bin. If you want to have feed transferred to smaller containers like IBC totes, there will be an extra \$10 charge to fill each additional container.

Payment Terms are Net 3 Business Days via ACH bank draft. The first bulk order must be paid prior to delivery.

Our Feed Is Not Treated With Preservatives or Pesticides. As such, we do not recommend purchasing more than a 45 day supply of feed, particularly in hot, summer months. Insect eggs that are naturally occuring in the field at the time of grain harvest can hatch under warm conditions.
